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International Network of Health Promoting Hospitals and Health Services (HPH)

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE

The International Network of Health Promoting Hospitals and Health Services was initiated by the World Health Organization to put into action the WHO principles of health promotion, which concern patients, staff, community and the environment of hospitals and health services. The Network has now come to a stage of sustainability enabling it to become a legal entity and a main partner for collaboration with WHO.

Through this Constitution, the International HPH Network states its purpose and objectives, describes the rules for decisions for statutory bodies as well as the relationship with its members and international partners.

Article I NAME, AIMS, HEADQUARTERS

1. Mission

The Health Promoting Hospitals and Health Services of the International Network shall work towards incorporating the concepts, values, strategies and standards or indicators of health promotion into the organizational structure and culture of the hospital/health service. The goal is better health gain by improving the quality of health care, the relationship between hospitals/health services, the community and the **environment**, and the conditions for and satisfaction of patients, relatives and staff.




