1. LEADERSHIP: Prioritize Environmental Health

Green and Clean Program Thailand's Department of Health (Bureau of Environmental Health)

Philippine Government's Law Prohibiting Incineration of solid and medical wastes (year 2000 and 2003)

2. CHEMICALS:

Substitute Harmful Chemicals with Safer Alternatives

National laws, city wide rules & policies banning the use of mercury containing medical devices in health care facilities have been and are being done in Taiwan, Philippines, Mongolia, India, Indonesia, etc.

3. WASTE:

Reduce, Treat and Safely Dispose of Healthcare Waste

St Paul de Chartres 13 hospitals in the Philippines making use of proper health care waste management – waste minimization, segregation, non-burn system of treating and disposing of wastes, composting, etc.

4. ENERGY:

Implement Energy Efficiency and Clean Renewable Energy Generation

The 17th Somdejphrasangkharaj Hospital, under the Green and Clean program

5. WATER:

Reduce Hospital Water Consumption and Supply Potable Water

Bhopal's Sambhavna Trust Clinic, India Rainwater is harvested during the monsoon season and stored for use during the dry months of the year; recycled, or grey water is used for irrigation on hospital grounds.

6.TRANSPORTATION:

Improve Transportation Strategies for Patients and Staff

Purchase from local suppliers, and or suppliers who use fuel efficient transportation.

7. FOOD:

Purchase and Serve Sustainably Grown, Healthy Food

Green & Clean Program of Thailand – promoting food safety, organic food and community participation in agriculture activities for decreasing reliance on fertilizers, insecticides, etc

8. PHARMACEUTICALS:

Safely Manage and Dispose of Pharmaceuticals

In Sweden, a system has been set up to rank pharmaceuticals according to their environmental impact. This allows doctors to choose less environmentally harmful medicines when there is a choice of treatments for a given condition.

9.BUILDINGS:

Support Green and Healthy Hospital Design and Construction

Singapore: Changi General Hospital, Simei. At Changi General Hospital, the lobby features koi ponds, palm trees and orchid murals. There is a hydroponic garden on the hospital roof, which grows produce for the hospital kitchen while cooling the building

10.PURCHASING:

Buy Safer and More Sustainable Products and Materials

Utilize purchasing power to obtain environmentally responsible and ethically produced products at cost competitive prices & work with manufacturers & suppliers to innovate & expand the availability of products.
