




## Analysis of Taiwan Hospital CO<sub>2</sub> Emission Data



Sample size: 79 hospitals



#### CO<sub>2</sub> Emission Reduction Trend (compared to 2007 level)



Medical center has been decreasing CO<sub>2</sub> outputs steadily Regional hospitals and district hospitals show slight increasing trends – maybe due to increased operational capacity, but the trend is stabilizing.

Focus on advising hospitals that needed further improvements and continue to promote concepts of green hospital.

#### Climate Change and Public Health: Healthy Climate, Healthy People, Healthy Economy

Organized by Health Care Without Harm, Health & Environment Alliance, Environmental Quality Protection Foundation, and International Federation of Medical Students' Association (IFMSA)

Pendo Maro, Health Care Without Harm & Health and Environment Alliance, moderated the panel discussions, emphasizing the positive message available with tangible medium and long-term impacts to health, economy, and the environment.

Elena Villalobos, World Health Organization (WHO), emphasized the power of the health community, highlighting the increased participation in climate change negotiations. She acknowledged the progress made through partnerships, especially in advocacy. She indicated the gap between legal framework and action, referring to the Convention's definition of adverse effects of climate change, including: implications to health; and references to commitments such as reporting of any adaptation and mitigation programmes.

Nick Watts, IFMSA, outlined the outcome from the Summit that took place on 4 December 2011, that produced the Durban Declaration on Climate and Health. He highlighted the key actions: education and research coordination efforts; mitigation and adaptation within the health system; nationally-based advocacy, reframing issues to the public health sector as a mechanisms to mobilize society; and recognition of the utility of other platforms in addition to the UNFCCC process. He said "although we may be leaving COP 17 without a deal, we do not leave without hope and optimism, looking to the future with re-motivation.

Shu-Ti Chiou, International Network of Health Promoting Hospital & Health Services, explained the role of the health sector in the climate change crisis, urging for: advocacy; example setting in lowering greenhouse gas emissions; and promotion of health and environmental co-benefits such as breastfeeding. She celebrated the power of the health sector having a credible voice on health issues, sharing examples from Taiwan in the establishment of environmentally- friendly hospitals.

Ensuing discussions focused on: ability of communities to influence climate negotiations; utilization of existing instruments; exposure to harmful chemicals in hospitals; gender issues and potential for disaggregating data to provide evidence of social implication of climate change; education challenges and opportunities; links to financing; and risk reduction.

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#### Could Public Health Benefits Make Combating Climate Change Free?

Climate change threatens human health, therefore reducing greenhouse gas emissions may help our medical well-being, too

Public health infrastructure has its own-role to play in combating climate change. For example, hospitals can curb solid waste by promoting breast milk over formula for infants, or simply cut down on nonessential energy use. The Taiwanese branch of a network of some 800 hospitals worldwide has set itself a target of reducing emission by 13 percent below 2007 levels by 2020. "That's equal to reforesting 34 New York City Central Parks," says Dr. Chiou Shu-ti, director-general of Taiwan's Bureau of Health Promotion and vice chairperson of the <u>International Network of Health</u> <u>Promoting Hospitals</u>.






# 6. What Are the Next Steps?



## **Monitoring Tools Analysis**



Monitoring tools are categorized as: Guided Document, Indicator and Calculator.

- Monitoring tools are VOLUNTARY basis, as there are no globally BINDING criteria.
- The globally divergent nature makes universal criteria a difficult task.



# **Manual of HPH and Environment**

 The draft has been proposed by Professor Hanne Tonnesen, and it is under modifying process by the HPH Secretariat to add more environmental factors.



## **Draft Policy Guidance**

- Follows the ToR 1 & 4
- Call for health professionals to promote environment-friendly policies
- Covering 6 scopes:
  - Vision
  - Goal
  - Strategy
  - Subject & Principle
  - Measurable, Reporting and Verification (MRVs)
  - Management
- Test trial in Taiwanese hospitals
- To be discussed during the 4th Task Force Meeting
