TWICE a month, 18-year-old student Lai Bee Sin takes an hour-long bus ride from Choa Chu Kang to Alexandra Hospital.

It is not because he is ill or visiting patients there. He is just a foot-haller "in love" with the hospital's soccer field.

It's in great condi-tion, and I get to use it for free," he said happily.

The hospital, mettled in Queenstown housing estate, opened its grounds to the public a year ago and response has been overwhelming.

The 40-year-old housewife added: There are not many nature apots in Singapore. I'm very glad that the hospital has opened up its


